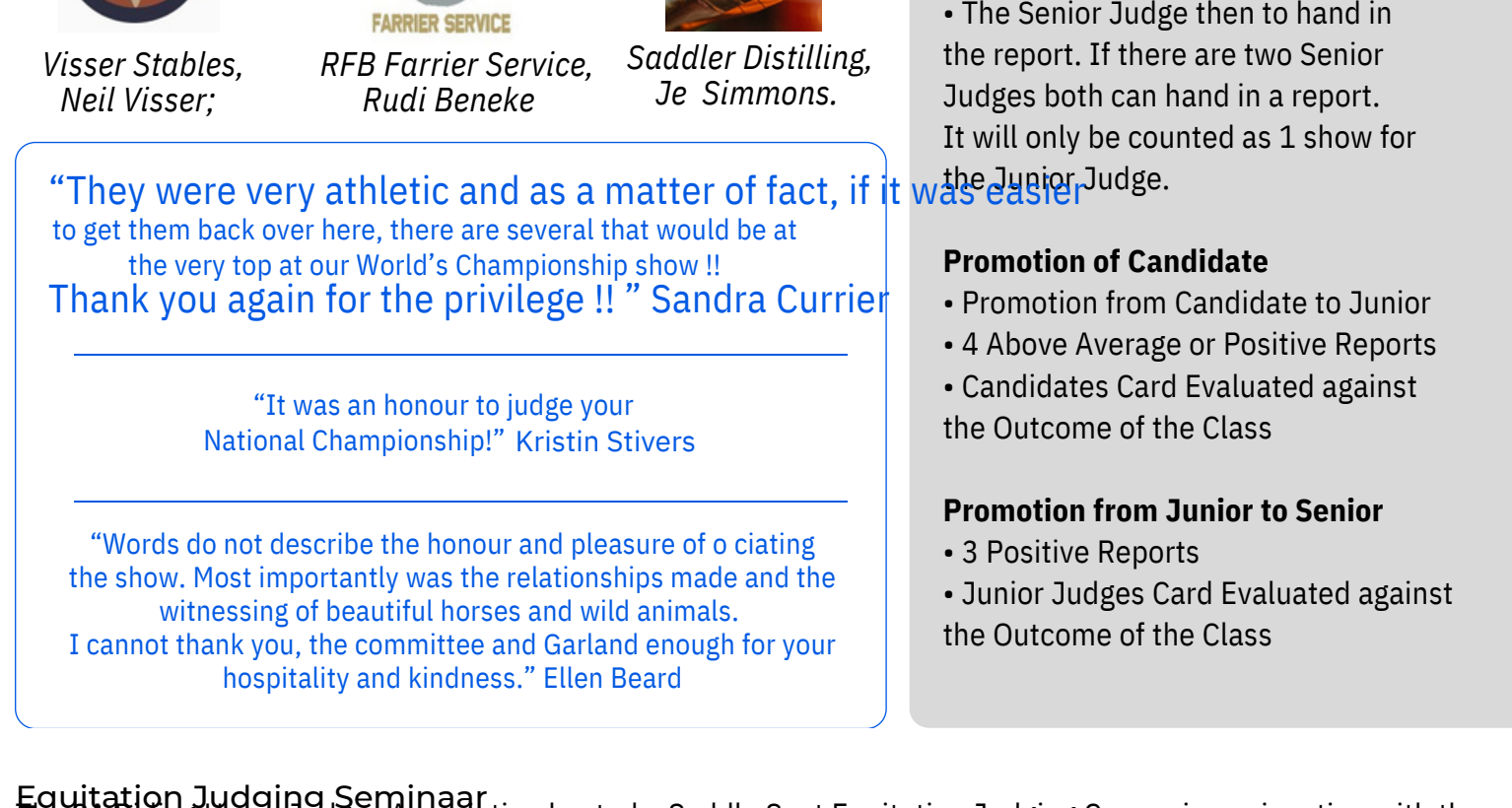
Equitation Judging Seminar

The SA Riding Horse Judges Association hosted a Saddle Seat Equitation Judging Course in conjunction with the Saddle Seat SANESA National Championships 2021.

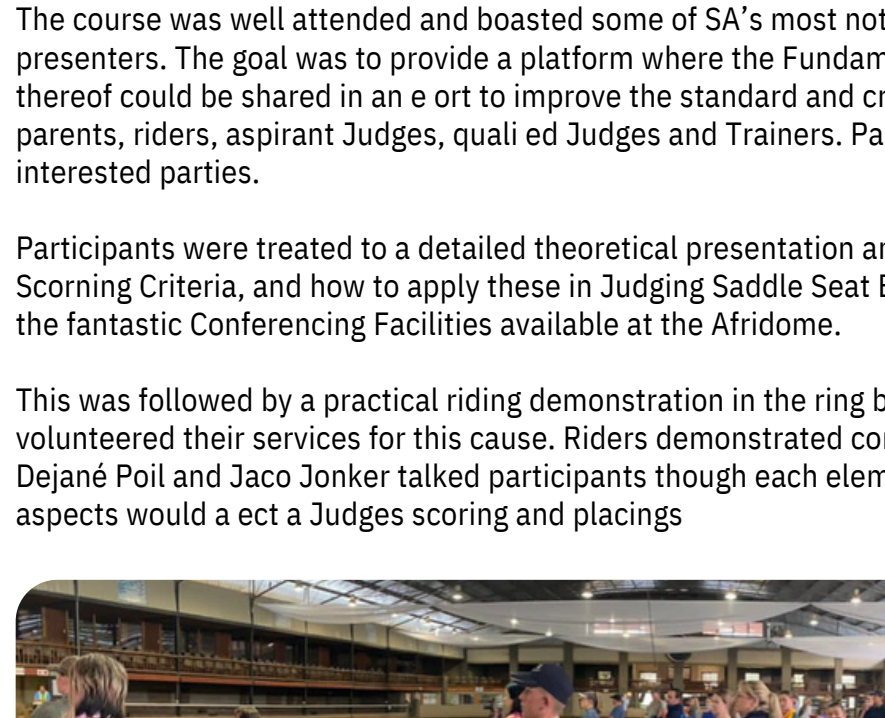
The course was well attended and boasted some of SA's most notable Equitation Judges as participants and presenters. The goal was to provide a platform where the Fundamentals of Saddle Seat Equitation and the Judging thereof could be shared in an effort to improve the standard and create cohesion amongst interested parties: parents, riders, aspirant Judges, qualified Judges and Trainers. Participants truly represented the full spectrum of interested parties.

Participants were treated to a detailed theoretical presentation and discussion on Saddle Seat Equitation, The Scoring Criteria, and how to apply these in Judging Saddle Seat Equitation presented by Dejané Poil making use of the fantastic Conferencing Facilities available at the Afridome.

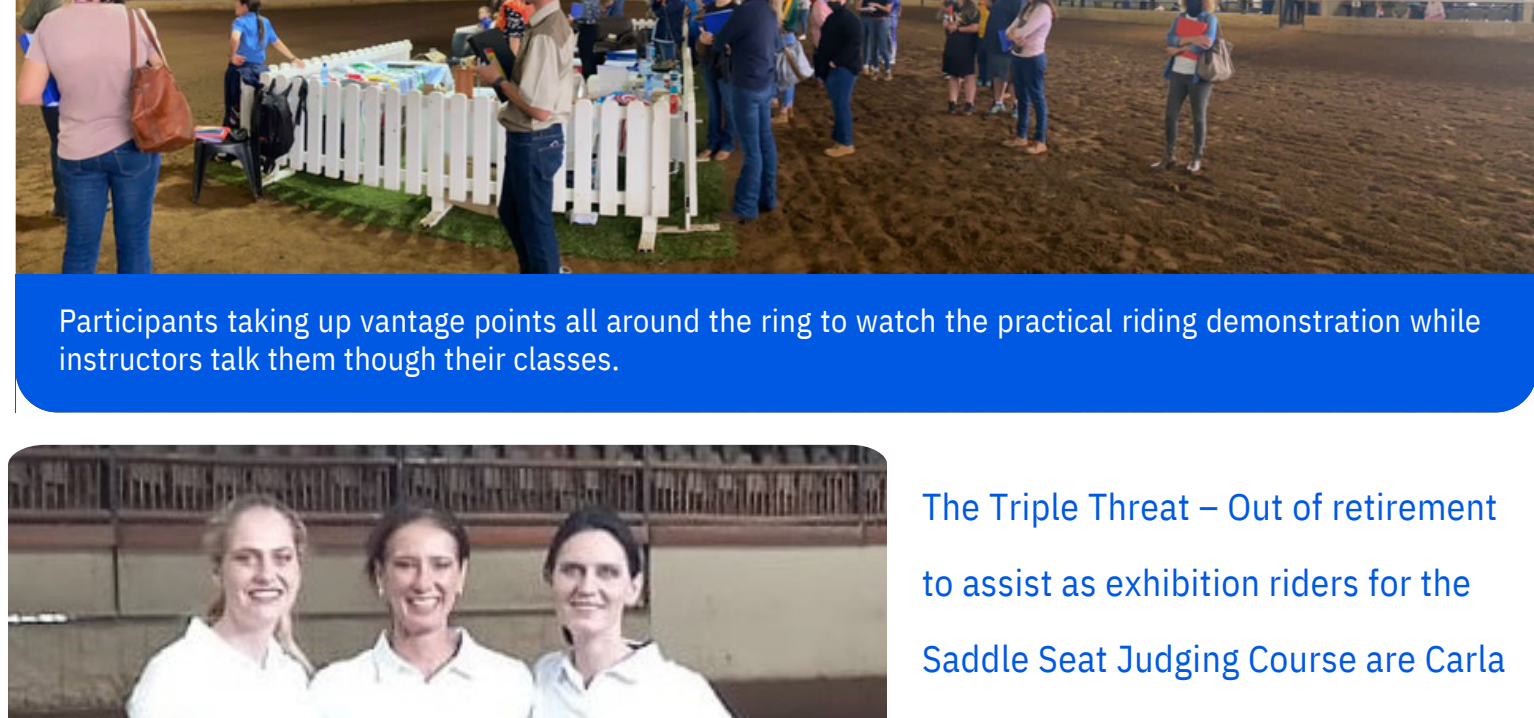
This was followed by a practical riding demonstration in the ring by a team of former Elite Equitation Riders who volunteered their services for this cause. Riders demonstrated correct and incorrect aids and pattern work while Dejané Poil and Jaco Jonker talked participants through each element and provided insight as to how the various aspects would affect a Judges scoring and placements



Participants taking up vantage points all around the ring to watch the practical riding demonstration while instructors talk them through their classes.

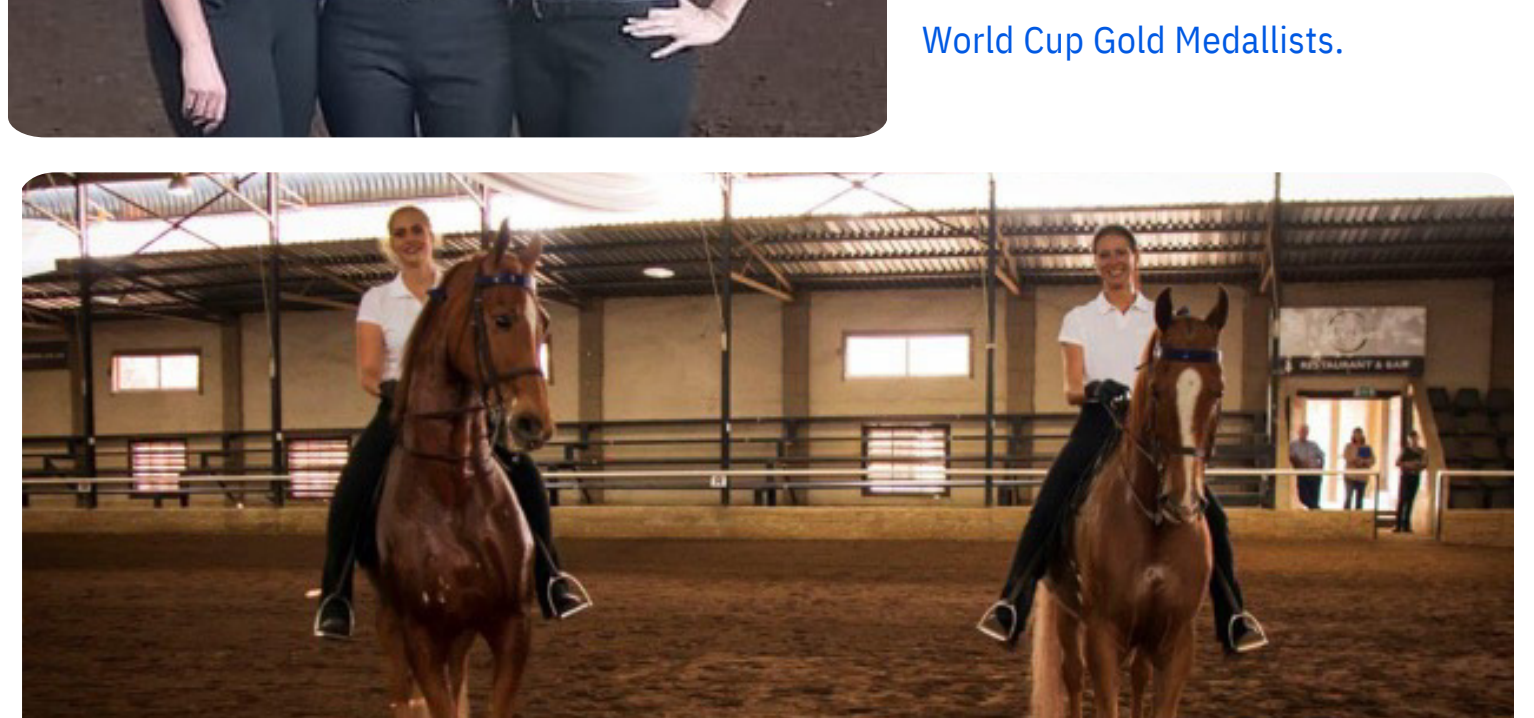

It was then time for the SANESA official classes to begin again and participants were divided into two groups and invited to try their hand at Judging Equitation Classes and Patterns from inside the ring and outside the ring in turn, with Dejané and Jaco providing insight and commentary throughout. Finally, those who so wished were permitted to scribe for the Official Judges in an effort to learn from them and gain first hand experience of the working relationship between Judge and Scribe.

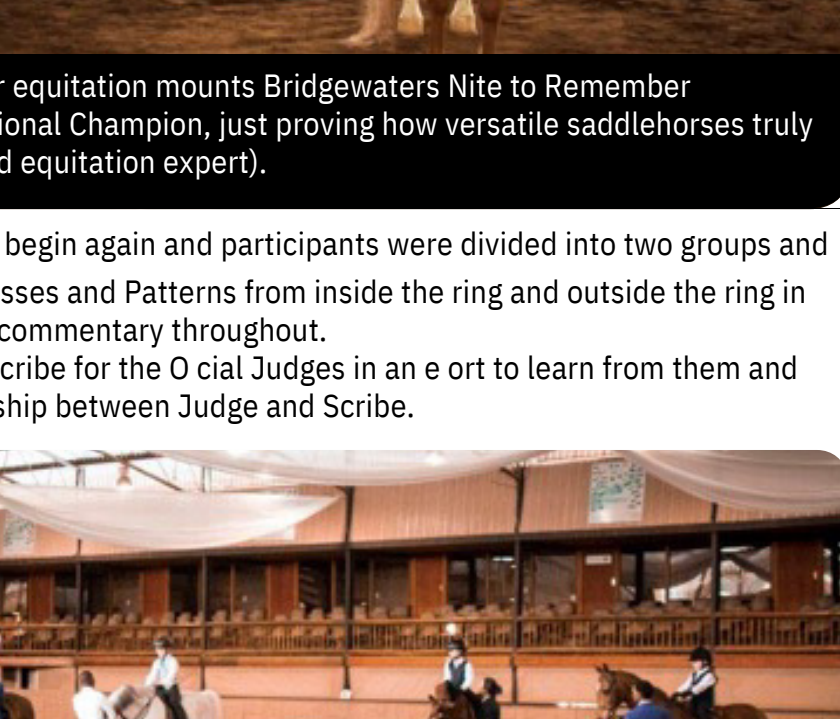


Official Judges and participants serving as scribes during the line-up of a very full lead line class.

Attendance of the course will count towards the Riding Horse Judges Association of SA Judges qualification criteria.

Judges Qualification

PROCESS OF QUALIFICATION

Candidate Judge

- Candidate Judge must complete the examinations and pass prior to moving on to Practical Assessment.

- The Ring Stewards Course and Examination will form part of the qualification process. Candidate Judges will need to attend the course and write the examination. This will replace the Ring Routine segment.

- Candidate must then complete Practical Assessment:

- 1 SANESA SHOW
- All classes to be judged.

1 REGIONAL SHOW FROM OUTSIDE THE RING

- Candidate must judge the Championships on the national day with a Senior Judge outside the ring.

- The Candidate Judge must place the class for confirmation, the senior will do the same. The placings then to be compared and the Senior to give an evaluation. [A form for this purpose will be provided by the Judges Association- the Senior Judge must send a copy by whatever means to the secretary of their own card and the candidates card for this purpose].

2 REGIONAL OR CLUB SHOWS FROM INSIDE THE RING

- Candidate to Judge the entire show.

- If the Regional Show does not have sufficient Saddle Horses then the candidate may be asked to do a 3rd show.

- The Senior Judge then to hand in the report. If there are two Senior Judges both may hand in a report. It will only be counted as 1 show for the candidate however.

Junior Judge

- Junior Judge must then complete Practical Assessment to be promoted to Senior Judge:

3 SHOWS: REGIONAL, CLUB OR SANESA NATIONALS FROM INSIDE THE RING (MAY BE ANY COMBINATION)

- Candidate to Judge the entire show.

- If the Regional Show does not have at least 80 Saddle Horses then the Junior Judge may be asked to do a 4th show.

- The Senior Judge then to hand in the report. If there are two Senior Judges both can hand in a report. It will only be counted as 1 show for the Junior Judge.

Promotion of Candidate

- Promotion from Candidate to Junior

- 4 Above Average or Positive Reports

- Candidates Card Evaluated against the Outcome of the Class

Promotion from Junior to Senior

- 3 Positive Reports

- Junior Judges Card Evaluated against the Outcome of the Class
